



A COMPLETE LIST OF WHAT IS CONSIDERED RECYCLABLE MATERIAL AND NOT RECYCLABLE MATERIAL.

FIBER BIN

YES:

All office paper
White paper
Colored paper
Newspaper (bags and strings removed)
Magazines (all types)
Catalogs (all types)
Phonebooks (all types)
Junk Mail
Paperboard
Tissue Boxes
Heavy Weight folders
Paper Towel and Toilet Paper rolls
Food packaging (un-waxed only please)
Shredded paper (in plastic bag to minimize blow-away potential)
Paper milk, juice and soy milk cartons (should be clean and empty)
Books: all soft cover, hard covers should be ripped off
Empty paper coffee cups (plastic lids removed)
Pizza boxes (food and wax paper removed)
Corrugated cardboard
Brown paper bags
Boxboard (i.e. shoeboxes, give boxes, cereal boxes)

CO-MINGLE BIN

YES:

Metal and tin beverage containers
Metal and tin food containers
Aluminum foil
Aluminum take-out containers
Aluminum pie plates and trays
Kitchen cookware: metal pots, pans, tins and utensils
Glass

“Please Wash Out ALL Food Jars”

All color glass bottles and jars
Clear Glass
Green Glass
Brown Glass
Blue Glass
Glass food containers
Beer and Wine Bottles
All plastics numbers 1-7 (all recyclable plastics have a recycling emblem, with a number in the centre indicating the type of plastic.) No marking, then it is not recyclable
Food and beverage containers
Screw top jars
Plastic cups (lids and straws removed)
Milk jugs
Soap bottles
Clean grocery shopper bags and retail plastic bags (no other type accepted)
Plastic jugs/bottles; soda bottles, laundry detergent jugs

Please wash out all food jars!

ALL cardboard boxes must be broken down. Remember...all Recyclable material must be clean or free of contaminates regarding food products. If you are unable to clean the item, then it will have to be placed with common household trash.

The following material is known as common household trash and is not recyclable.

NO:

Potato Chip Bags
Styrofoam Peanuts
Napkins
Tissue paper
Paper towels
Wax paper
Wrapping paper
Any paper product which has the potential to be contaminated with bodily fluids.
Cardboard lined with plastic (i.e. bubble wrap boxes, pet food bags)
Waxed / waterproof cardboard
Light bulbs
Mirror glass
Window glass
Ceramic or marble
Crystal

Motor oil cans *these items are recycled in a separate container from the regular recycling materials

Metal and cardboard containers contaminated with oil based products
Paint cans
Children’s toys (unless marked with recycling emblem and type by number indicated)
Styrofoam Peanut packing (used for packing breakable material)

Styrofoam *these items are recycled in a separate container from the regular recycling materials

Formed Styrofoam
Deli-style containers
Clam-shell take-out containers
